I. Background:

The Sustainable Human settlements in Urban areas for Reintegration in Afghanistan (SHURA) program, is designed in line with the corresponding contribution Agreement, signed between the European Union, the Danish Ministry of Foreign Affairs and UN-Habitat. The Program is being implemented with the coordination authority of the Ministry of Refugees and Repatriation (MORR), Ministry of Urban Development and Housing (MUDH), The Afghanistan Independent Land Authority (ARAZI), Independent Directorate for Local Governance (IDLG), the Afghanistan high-level Displacement and Return Executive Committee (DiREC) to which UN-HABITAT provides implementation outputs.

The Program entails four components:

- Outcome 1: Provide a foundation for returnees and protracted IDPs to become self-reliant, resilient and productive citizens of Afghanistan as quickly as possible
- Outcome 2: Facilitate the integration through the provision of well-located, serviceable land with access to appropriate livelihood opportunities and in proximity to urban centers, secondary and tertiary cities and strategic district municipalities.
- Outcome 3: Augment self-reliance through the delivery of permanent development interventions to ensure access to permanent housing and basic services in appropriate sites in parallel with humanitarian/transitional assistance.
- Outcome 4: Mitigate the negative effects of an unplanned influx of returnees and prevent further ad hoc settlement in urban informal settlements

Within the context of the Project, MUDH, IDLG and UN-HABITAT will develop Design(s) for construction works conceptualizations for the provinces of high returns for purposes of reintegration of returnees, IDPs and vulnerable host community. The scope of works will

include: Housing, water drilling and reticulation to the neighborhood, public facilities, sewer system, roads, drainages and environmental hazard mitigation works (including retaining walls, submerged dams, weirs or culverts). SHURA will also finance smaller-scale material production investments to support localized livelihoods dividend's.

II. Roles/responsibilities of physical site development/shelter specialist:

Technical advice for Planning and implementation of SHURA reintegration projects:

1. Participation for housing, labor, skill and dependency/vulnerability needs assessments.
2. Physical Planning and implementation modalities for shelter/infrastructure/technical aspects of reintegration projects.
3. Supporting the implementation of impact assessments of reintegration projects.
4. Documentation of best practice in the shelter/infrastructure developments.
5. Development of action plans to ensure timely and effective delivery of shelter support and other program components.
6. Assigning roles and responsibilities to field teams, site engineers, CDCs and other stakeholders.
7. Assist CDCs implementing groups to set priorities for the reintegration programs, considering available resources and limited timeframes for implementation.
8. Work with national and local authorities on the technical project elaboration, the supervision of ongoing construction works, and the technical acceptance/handover of completed projects, to ensure professional standards adherences.
9. Develop effective monitoring mechanisms for effective delivery and progress mapping,
10. Supervise program implementation and ensure adherence to common guidelines for identification of housing beneficiaries, standards for construction, and other program components, as well as for implementation procedures approved by DiREC
11. Provide technical field level managerial oversight to facilitate smooth implementation of the assisted reintegration in the provinces of high returns
12. Produce and regularly submit progress reports on projects. Consolidate reports and provide feedback on the findings/recommendations of reports provided by implementing partners and other sources.

Technical collaboration under the SHURA reintegration framework:

1. Technical support to relevant clusters and committees established by DiREC
2. Provide input to committees in terms of settlement planning and actual implementation.
3. Inventory and analysis of past urban housing work in Afghanistan (including UN-Habitat's work),
4. Develop and strengthen partnerships with relevant institutions, universities and experts involved in the settlement development
5. Strategic settlement conceptualization and housing policy support in the context of different hazards in Afghanistan.
6. Develop and promote a more systematic local policy approaches for self-organized settlement management in Afghanistan,
7. Through consultation with stakeholders contribute to build up dialogue and partnership with relevant agents in the development context, such as civil society, NGOs, private sector actors, institutional and multi-institutional partners, etc.,

8. Organize and manage consultative meetings with relevant government agencies/ departments, NGOs and other relevant stakeholders to finalize action plans to ensure effective delivery of shelter related supports,
9. Contribute to develop demonstration models of hazard specific settlements as maybe appropriate.
10. Create awareness among Disaster Management Committees (DMC's) across levels on relevant aspects of disaster resilient shelter.
11. Conduct comprehensive Multi-dimensional assessments involving affected communities, local government authorities, implementing partners, with special emphasis on medium to long term durable housing solutions.

Advice to UN-HABITAT organizational and procedural structure:

1. Review the technical deliverables in the SHURA program ProDoc and prepare an initiation report.
2. Participate as relevant in UN-HABITAT Reintegration Core Group and assist to elaborate appropriate disaster preparedness and SURGE mechanisms and expert resource deployment systems for disaster situations,
3. Participate in technical and financial evaluation committees for bids, and proposals as required
4. Address the immediate shelter needs of the disaster affected population and enable them to return to their homes.
5. Contribute to economic reintegration and restoration of livelihoods by boosting construction activities and rebuilding infrastructure, work places, etc. destroyed or affected by disaster
6. Support policy development and adoption of relevant practice and procedures for long - term rehabilitation and reconstruction of housing, infrastructure and other relevant sectors in Afghanistan
7. Provide input to the Afghanistan Shelter Cluster in development of structural mitigation measures to improve the resistance of structures to future disasters.

III. Qualification and Experience Requirements:

Corporate Competencies:

- Promote UN's values and ethical standards (tolerance, integrity, respect, results orientation, impartiality);
- Display cultural, gender, religion, race, nationality and age sensitivity and adaptability
- Excellent coordination and implementation skills;
- Ability to quickly build effective working relationships with fellow advisors, colleagues and Afghan government officials;
- Ability to analyse complex situations and problems and identify and implement effective solutions;
- Ability to multi-task and meet multiple challenging and competing deadlines;
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team;
- Display cultural, gender, religion, race, nationality and age sensitivity and adaptability.

Knowledge Management and Learning:

- Demonstrates professional competence and mastery of subject matter;
- Promote knowledge management in IDLG/DMM and a learning environment in the office through leadership and personal example;

- Actively work towards continuing personal learning and development in one or more practice areas, act on learning plans and apply newly acquired skills.

Management and Leadership:

- Build strong relationships with clients, focuses on impact and result for the client and responds positively to feedback;
- Consistently approach work with energy and a positive, constructive attitude;
- Demonstrate good oral and written communication skills;
- Demonstrate openness to change and ability to manage complexities.

Education:

Master's Degree in Civil engineering, or Housing economics, or construction management or other relevant qualifications

Work Experience:

- Minimum of 7 years of relevant experience including 3 years in the field of construction management and housing development with international organizations.
- Experience in Housing project(s) implementation at scale. experience in built environment monitoring and evaluation will be an added advantage.
- Experience in the usage of construction/engineering and designing software and office software packages advantageous to monitoring.

Language and Communication Skills:

Fluency in written and spoken English is required. Knowledge of another UN language and/or National Local Language Dari/ Pashto would be an advantage.

International Travel (Home – Kabul):

The cost of a return economy class air-ticket from the place of recruitment on least-cost, and visa fee will be reimbursed upon submission of travel claim together with the supporting documents including copy of e-ticket, receipts and used boarding passes. Three quotations from reputable travel agents shall be submitted for UN-Habitat's clearance prior to purchase of tickets.

Local Transportation:

Such as vehicle arrangements to provinces will be covered by UN-Habitat.

Travel Advice/Requirements:

The PHYSICAL SITE DEVELOPMENT/SHELTER SPECIALIST must abide by all UN security instructions. Upon arrival he/she must attend a security briefing provided by UNDSS. He/she should undertake Basic and Advanced Security Training as prescribed by UNDSS. Regular missions will be undertaken for which UNDSS authorisation must be sought.
